These requests exceed 500 individual projects totaling more than \$4.7 billion.</p> <p>It is important to note the projects on this list have not been submitted by Senator Begich or funded. The 2010 appropriations process is just beginning and will last through the end of May. Senator Begich will be working with his colleagues on the Appropriations Committee, (especially Senator Lisa Murkowski), to encourage funding of some of these projects. When we know which projects are funded, we will let all requestors know. We'll post all the results on the Senator's website.
